Three area women take part in world's greatest scavenger hunt



Three local women spent an entire week stepping outside their comfort zones while putting a smile on plenty of faces.

Colette Bachand, Paige Brenneis and Alexis Ebert took part in GISHWES — The Greatest International Scavenger Hunt the World Has Ever Seen.

GISHWHES is a five-time Guinness World Record breaking scavenger hunt hosted by Misha Collins, star of the television series *Supernatural*.

The event ran Aug. 1 to 8 and the three women and Bachand's boyfriend formed a team with some Americans to try and accomplish as many of the 259 items on the list as possible. The group managed 75 of the tasks. Blanchard, Brenneis, and Ebert accomplished roughly 30 of that number.

Bachand dressed as Edmonton's much-hated silver balls monument and stood by the real chrome balls while waving at traffic, and got a 10-second video of herself shown on the big screen at an Edmonton cinema. She also went on a date to a fancy restaurant with a stuffed muskrat and got to dress as a ghost barista at a Starbucks.

Brenneis created some flyers for toilets that said flush only when full, got a GISHWHES coffee added to the menu board at the Green Bean, and held a funeral for Death. The latter involved her dressing as one of the male characters from the television show and filming the scene, a recreation based on the *Supernatural* TV show.

One of Ebert's contributions was to walk into a Subway and ask for a BLT sub with no bacon, lettuce or tomato. The request also had to have no bread. In fact, the breadless sandwich wound up being nothing but condiments, which she ate at the counter off the wax paper to the amusement of staff and customers. She also helped promote a petition to save the endangered unicorn, one that got lots of signatures.

All of the scavenger hunt items had to have photo or video evidence, and the group chronicled all of their scavenger hunt activities.

Regardless of the activity, the antics put a smile on people's faces, even popping out a taxidermy muskrat at a fine dining establishment.

"Everything that we did that was uncanny, people smiled at," Bachand said. "They find it really amusing, which is kind of cool. It's like a small act of random kindness to make someone's day."



That waiter will never forget that [muskrat], nor will the people on the Whitemud."

Although the women accomplished roughly 30 items on the list, some were higher on their memory lists than others.

For Brenneis, portraying one of her favourite show's characters for Death's Funeral was a highlight.

Bachand said there were three she was most fond of, but dressing as the silver balls and waving at Whitemud drivers was probably the highlight.

"Almost every person smiled and waved at me, and about 40 per cent of the people gave me a toot," she said.

But there was more to the week of silliness than getting a few smiles and a few car honks. The women found GISHWHES took them outside their comfort zones a bit.

"[I got] an incredible boost in confidence and an uncanny ability to believe anything is possible," Bachand said, adding getting a 10-second video projected on a theatre screen was evidence of that. "You can't shut down an idea until you've tried."

Brenneis also found the event gave her an incredible boost in confidence. "I'm nervous about asking people stuff," she said. "One of the items we had to do was get a TV show host or talk show host to sneeze GISHWHES on the air as if they're subtly trying to bring it up. For numerous days, and numerous times during each day I phoned." Although she was not successful in her bid, the experience built her confidence in being tenacious.

The annual GISHWHES event draws thousands of participants from more than 100 countries to do some random acts of kindness, step outside their comfort zone while being artistic and creative.



National Column: Wright opens door on PMO scheming

For the first time since he drew up the infamous bank draft 29 months ago, Nigel Wright sat calmly in the witness box and precisely explained why he decided to transfer \$90,000 to Mike Duffy.

He explained the "good to go" email after a meeting with Stephen Harper and he walked a courtroom through the increasingly frustrating and heated negotiations with the moving target known as Duffy, the tentacles of this damage control effort stretching through Harper's office.

Wright was poised, never flustered, under benign questioning, but still so much of this makes no sense.

Because Wright was swiftly put through his paces by a friendly Crown, there were too many answers left hanging without follow up and even more questions left unasked.

Emails released Wednesday that buttress some earlier missives released by the RCMP show the extraordinary lengths Harper's office went to to craft a narrative for Duffy, put him in a "different bucket," remove him from an audit, burnish his Prince Edward Island bona fides and do whatever was needed to make this problem go away.

They agreed to put some "down-home Mike Duffy" in an agreed-upon statement and dealt with Duffy demands that his case never be referred to the RCMP, that Government leader

Marjory LeBreton urge caucus to vote against any move to remove him from the Senate - all against constant carping that he didn't have the money to repay his dubious expenses.

Harper knew nothing more than the broad strokes, we are told, because his office wouldn't let him get down in the weeds, a proposition as perplexing today as it was in 2013.

Wright never told Harper he was paying Duffy's \$90,000 in inappropriate expenses, backing Harper's long-held narrative. Why didn't he tell him? We don't know. Wright was never asked.

He described marching down to Harper's office in the Langevin Block to get prime ministerial approval on media lines for a matter "of some controversy," which were actually lines that misrepresented Duffy's spending problem.

Wright knew he was putting pressure on a caucus member to repay money he thought he might not actually owe, was worried about a precedent because other senators were facing similar questions and wanted to alert the PM to potential "caucus management" issues at play. But there was no mention of the means of payment.

He never told Harper there was a plan afoot to repay Duffy \$32,000 (as the tab was then thought to be) from the Conservative fund - money raised from donors - or that Duffy's legal

fees would be paid by the fund.

These were just not typically the matters he would trouble Harper over, Wright said, even though Harper was already immersed in the Duffy problem and had publicly debated him (along with Wright who intervened) after a Conservative caucus about nine days earlier.

And then there was the \$90,000 transfer itself. Wright says he now regrets it, says it was a hasty decision but a private one.

If it became public, he thought he would be embarrassed and admits he didn't think through all the connotations of the decision.

For a man who was such a titan on Bay Street, perhaps it is second nature to try to spend yourself out of trouble - to put a price tag on ending a problem, but it's hard to believe he would advise executives at

troubled companies to dip into their own wallets to repay possibly fraudulent expenses.

As he testified, \$90,000 wasn't going to put a dent in his net worth.

But the altruism card was overlaid. "I

viewed it as helping out our system and government," Wright said, who said he had to keep such a good deed quiet.

Besides, he had a deal with Duffy and it had to be fulfilled, "and I couldn't think of another way to do it."

But the deal was cut when it was thought Duffy owed \$32,000. A "beyond furious" Wright continued to honour a deal even when the tab topped \$90,000.

On day one, Wright, as expected, protected Harper. Tougher days of cross-examination loom but nothing burst onto the campaign trail Wednesday. But voters should probably wonder about a bloated office purportedly running the country that was consumed with secret machinations to protect the reputation of a man abusing taxpayer money.

Town says chemical spill posed no environmental or human risks

Nearly seventeen litres of spilled paint on 100 Street Monday afternoon closed the road for three hours but posed no environmental or human risk; the Town told media Wednesday afternoon.

Morinville RCMP received a call Monday afternoon around 3:30 p.m. about a chemical spill on 100 Street in the area of the industrial park. Morinville Enforcement Services was asked to attend the call.

Peace Officers detoured traffic to avoid motorists driving through the spill until it could be

determined what it was. Five containers or paint and paint thinner fell out of a truck's box and spilled into the southbound lane.

Although the driver of the truck and the company worked to contain and clean up the spill, the driver faces a \$776 fine for driving with an unsecured load.

The Town says a large number of drivers drove around road blockades, ignoring Peace Officer direction. Those drivers face further charges.

Calls were made to Morinville Public Works and the Provincial Dangerous Good Information Centre, the latter agency confirming there was no environmental or human risk concerns.

Ambrose talks economy and security with local Rotarians

Canada's economy and national security were the main topics of a 20-minute presentation to local Rotarians by Federal Minister of Health and Sturgeon River–Parkland Conservative candidate Rona Ambrose Aug. 12.

The Rotary visit was Ambrose's second to the Morinville club. Her first visit was where she announced she would be running in the newly announced Sturgeon River — Parkland riding.

Ambrose told Rotarians her government has been focused over the last nine years on the issues they believe matter to Canadians: creating jobs, focusing on financial security, lowering taxes for families, and keeping Canadians safe in what Ambrose said is an increasingly dangerous world.

"Prime Minister Harper has made, I believe, very careful and principled choices that reflect the values of hardworking Canadians across this

country," Ambrose said, adding she believed the true mark of a leader was achieving success in times of risk and danger. "We've seen economic risk, whether it was in the 2008 Great Recession or around the world in economic instability and also the danger of ISIS."

Ambrose said during the 2008 financial crisis, Harper promised to set a course towards balanced budgets once the recession was over and to do so not by raising taxes but by controlling spending and reining in costs. "Canada continues to be exposed to what is a fragile global economy, but under the strong leadership of Prime Minister Harper, Canada has made the right choices through the global recession. We have weathered this economic instability with a certain plan. that plan is low taxes, a balanced budget now, economic growth and benefits going directly to family in the forms of either direct cash benefits or low taxes."

Ambrose said the result has been a considerable rise in employment since 2008, numbers she says are 20 per cent higher than the closest G7 competitor. "You've created in the economy 1.2 million new jobs," she said. "Government doesn't create jobs. We create the environment for job creation. It's businesses that create jobs."

The Conservative candidate went on to say Canada is the only G7 member to have the highest Triple A credit rating from all the major rating agencies. "That makes a big difference to people who are thinking about investing in our country," Ambrose said, adding Canada's GDP has increased more and its debt-to-GDP ratio is lower than any G7 country. "Again, that's what everyone looks at when they are thinking of investing in our country. Now both the International Monetary Fund and OECD [Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development] now expect Canada to be among the strongest growing economies in the G7 over a number of years. The World Economic Forum has now ranked Canada's banks as the best in the world for seven years in a row."

Ambrose said her government reduced business taxes to 11 per cent and are planning to reduce them to 9 per cent, a measure that will reduce business taxes by \$2.7 billion. It is money

Ambrose and her party believe will create additional Canadian jobs.

"Because of the tax measures Prime Minister Harper has put in place for small businesses, by 2019 the tax burden on small businesses will be cut in half," she said. "This means an annual tax reduction of up to \$38,600 that can be reinvested in a business to grow and hire more people. and that's exactly what we want to see."

National Security

Ambrose spent the second half of her presentation talking about national security and the threat of ISIS.

"We are in a different world now because this threat of Jihadism that isn't just coming from parts of Asia and Africa where there's failed states where these guys hide in refuge and plot their next attack. We're now seeing ISIS attacks in places like Australia, France and Belgium, and, of course, here in Canada, we've had two attacks so far."

Ambrose said Jihadist terrorism is not a future possibility but a present day reality, one that could arise again in Canada. "These terrorist, these barbarians as I call them, seek to harm us here in Canada. We've been harmed by them. We've been targeted by them, and they want to harm us because they hate our way of life. They hate our tolerance, our freedom of religion and freedom of speech."

Ambrose went on to say what separates her party's leader from other leaders in the world and at home is that Harper has not been afraid to confront the issue and call it what it is.

"I would say the highest responsibility of any government, of any Canadian government, is that we keep Canadians freedoms strong and keep Canadians safe," Ambrose said.

Communities in Bloom judges visit Morinville

Communities in Bloom judging took place in Morinville Aug. 12. Judges Doug Hornbeck and Berta Briggs did a tour of the town with Allen Jacobson, Community Development Coordinator, and Donald Fairweather, Operations Manager

Stops included the Town entrance signs, South Glens, Grandin Heights Park, Belle Park, The Lakes, and Sunshine / Sunnydale, Trails. Judges had a look at how things were blooming at the Chamber Of Commerce, Notre Dame School, Primeau School, and MCHS, as well as SJB Park, Perras Place, and other locations in town.

At MCHS, Urban Ag teacher Neil Korotash showed judges the nasturtium, an annual whose leaves and flowers are edible. He also showed them the garden the students planted. Urban Agriculture students grow grapes to make jelly, tomatoes to make salsa, and garlic and the hot peppers to make hot sauce. The class teaches students about farm to table and

includes 15 farm visits, including a conventional and organic wheat farm.

Part of their Morinville stop over was touring this year's Best Garden contest winners properties.

Communities in Bloom began in Canada in 1995 and was originally inspired by Britain in Bloom, Tidy Towns of Ireland and Villes et Villages Fleuris de France. CIB was originally started in Alberta by a group of dedicated volunteers, and operated by them for many years. In 2006, the Alberta Recreation and Parks Association (ARPA) undertook the responsibility of the administration of the CIB. Communities in Bloom is more than just flowers. It looks at the municipality and recognizes its role in the community, economic development, civic pride, environmental responsibility, and quality of life. The six elements of judging include tidiness, environmental action, heritage conservation, urban forestry, landscape and floral displays.

Results will be unveiled at the 2015 Provincial Awards Ceremony to be held Sept. 12 in Whitecourt.





The Town of Westlock will celebrate its centennial in 2016, but preparations for that 100th-anniversary celebration are already well on the way. Part of those plans include a centennial celebration song and accompanying music video, being produced by Morinville's Smith Music and PMPI, the latter the owner of The Morinville News. The song, written by Smith with some assistance from the committee is called *Community With Spirit*.

Although the vocalists, including Westlock Mayor Ralph Leriger, were all recorded in Westlock, two of those singers — Mina Kwan and Jadeene Wolfe were in Morinville last week to rerecord a segment of the song. They have enjoyed being part of the project.

Kwan (photo right). "I've never really worked with a group like that, so just hearing the tracks and hearing it come together is great."

Kwan, an R.F. Staples student, said she has been in two choirs and the school's last three musicals.

A friend and first time singer Jadeene Wolfe also enjoyed the opportunity to be part of a song that captures her community's spirit and history.

"It was so much fun doing this," she said. "I enjoyed doing it. I found that I kind of like singing."

While both women liked being part of the project, they also enjoyed the opportunity to do a retake on one of their segments in Smith's Morinville studio. Initial audio and video recordings were conducted in Westlock Council Chambers.

"It was cool," Kwan said. "I've always wanted to see the equipment, see how it's set up, and hear it played back. I don't have any of that tech, but I like to start to do covers and get my music out there. This is cool. It's a taste of where I want to be."

Accompanying the song is a music video, produced by PMPI. The video includes both the talent singing the song and views of Westlock, its history and community spirit.

"It is always interesting to capture the essential elements of a community's story in images, whether they are stills or video," said PMPI owner Stephen Dafoe. "The process is similar to what we do with news each week, just with a snappier tempo."

Smith and Dafoe both see more work down the road for audio/video projects, both individually and collectively.

"People have taken notice of the impact and the power that audio/video can have on marketing and town spirit," Smith said. "Hockeyville proved that without a doubt."

The \$25,000 Morinville received for finishing in the top 10 in this year's Kraft Hockeyville event gets presented at the Ray McDonald Sports Center in a special ceremony Aug. 29.

Legal's Arinn Young helps forge another medal win

Legal resident, Arinn Young, and the Canadian Parapan Am Women's Wheelchair Basketball Team, captured silver at the Toronto 2015 Games on Friday after dropping the gold-medal final 80-72 to the United States. The silver-medal finish earns Young's team a berth into the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games.

Friday's defeat was the team's only loss of the tournament. The team opened the games with a 78-18 win over Guatemala and followed it with a 80-39 victory over Mexico. Taking a break for a day, the women returned to the court last Tuesday to defeat Brazil 82-51 and took Argentina in Thursday's semi-final 82-28.

Friday's contest with the Americans proved to be a bit of a battle. A cold first quarter saw Canada trailing 22-14, but they had closed the margin to 38-35 by the break. The Americans ended the third quarter with an eight-point run to widen the gap to 58-50 in their favour. Canada remained eight points behind by game's end, giving them silver.

During the games, Legal's Arinn Young played just under 45 minutes and earned Team Canada 48 points.




