



Canada Day hits the park this Friday

Historical and Cultural Society to have full slate of activities in SJB Park Friday

The flags are flying above Main Street in preparation for the Morinville Historical and Cultural Society's annual Canada Day in the Park event running Friday from noon until 3 p.m.

Although the festivities and participation have grown, organizer Murray Knight says patriotism and a sense of community remain at its core. Once again the celebration will carry the family picnic in the park theme.

"Canada Day's importance to a community can never be overlooked," Knight said. "For me — it's a big thing about my family and what my family has contributed in a couple of world wars and other people that I know have contributed to making this Country a better place to live."

This year's event starts at noon in St. Jean Baptiste Park with a free hot dog lunch supplied by Morinville Town Council. Opening ceremonies will commence at 12:45 p.m. and include the raising of the flag and singing of the National Anthem at 1 p.m. The serving of cake, ice cream and watermelon will follow the formal portion of the event. Other activities include face painting, bouncy castles, games and live music in the park from noon until 2:30 p.m.

Knight and the rest of the Historical and Cultural Society members are looking forward to seeing the park once again packed with families celebrating Canada's 149th birthday.

"It's a great family event. You bring your kids; you bring your grandma, grandpa, your dad and mom, whoever" Knight said. "It's just a great family time for four hours. It's just a great community event."

Canada Day festivities will include fireworks booming above the town. Residents are encouraged to come out to the Morinville Public School grounds where they will be launched at approximately 10:45 p.m.

Morinville girl to cut hair in support of fellow student

A Grade 2 Morinville Public School student, moved by the illness of a fellow student and ringette player, has decided to do something to be supportive.

Seven-and-a-half-year-old Talia Segreto decided to cut her more than 12 inches of blonde hair off in support of Kylee Houle, diagnosed with Anaplastic Large Cell Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma In April.

Miss Segreto came home from school June 17 after watching her principal and many fellow students get their head shaved at a school event. She told her mother, Sarah, that she wanted to do the same.

"I just thought it would be kind of nice to do it for Kylee since she has cancer," Miss Segreto said. "I wanted to know what it would feel like to be bald."

The MPS student said she was not nervous about having her head shaved next week. In fact, she said she's excited, and mother Sarah said Talia wanted to cut her hair off the moment she got home from school June 17.

But the actual head shave will wait another week so the family can prepare for Talia's other goal - raising some funds for the Stollery Children's Hospital.

The Segreto family will hold a barbecue at their home on 99 Street on July 8 at 6 p.m. with the head shave to take place at 7 p.m. Sarah Segreto said the family is providing the food, and all donations will go to buy items for the Stollery Children's Hospital.

"We're going to have some hot dogs and chips," Sarah Segreto said. "If people want to make a donation, that's great. We're going to get donations for the Stollery. The Houle family has a list of stuff they would like [for the hospital]. We're going to take Talia shopping so she has a part in what is being donated to the Stollery."

National Column:
Path to power in Alberta
tricky for Jason Kenney

Jason Kenney wouldn't tell me when we exchanged emails on Wednesday whether he's going to leave federal politics to unite Alberta's conservative forces. I suspect he doesn't know yet. He did say he's "getting very close to a decision."

Here are the options facing the Conservative MP for Calgary Midnapore. He could stay in federal politics and remain a hard-working opposition MP. He could run to replace Stephen Harper as the federal party's leader. That was what most people, including close friends of the former immigration minister, assumed until a few weeks ago he would do.

Or he could go home to Alberta, try to win the Progressive Conservative leadership vacated by his former federal cabinet colleague Jim Prentice, and then try to unite Alberta PCs with the Wildrose Party - over, it seems, the objections of his former federal Conservative caucus colleague, Brian Jean. And then try to defeat the province's NDP premier, Rachel Notley, in the next election.

Notice I said "try," three times. None of these steps is a slam dunk. Beating Notley might be the easiest part. Alberta's first NDP government has struggled with the same bundle of lousy news that allowed Notley to unseat the PCs in the first place: chronic low oil prices and rising unemployment. Her NDP has been behind Wildrose in polls all year, and in one poll they fell back to third place behind the PCs.

But I'd be reluctant to bet even on Notley's political demise. She has three years to turn things around, and Alberta has much more often returned incumbent governments than ejected them after a single term.

Meanwhile, Kenney would have to reunite Alberta's conservative parties. You could say he has experience, as a senior lieutenant to the guy who managed it at the federal level in 2003, Stephen Harper. The problem is that he was also a senior lieutenant to Stockwell Day, who tried to unite the parties before Harper did. And he was a senior lieutenant to Preston Manning, who tried to do it before Day did. Kenney knows these things fail more often than they succeed.

If for some reason he has forgotten, he could ask Prentice, the white knight swooping in from Ottawa (well, from semi-retirement in Toronto, but close enough) to rally the Alberta right in 2014. It ended badly.

And Prentice had advantages Kenney doesn't. The Conservative government in which he'd served hadn't yet lost. The Alberta PCs were the senior partner in any merger talks; in fact they, too, were still in power.

It's hard to remember now, but Prentice returned to Alberta as a kind of juggernaut, sweeping all before him. He managed to get nine Wildrose MNAs to defect to his party - including the leader, Danielle Smith. This had two main results. First, it awakened PC antibodies against the intruders, and Smith lost the nomination battle to run as a PC candidate. Second, it hardened the resolve of the Wildrose rump against the PCs. The survivors of Prentice's raid against Wildrose are not likely to look more kindly on a union today than they did only two years ago. None of this amounts to an argument that Kenney is the wrong man for the task.

He's smart, widely read and travelled, almost comically hardworking, and was a key contributor to Harper's success, when Harper was successful. Like Harper, he would run near the right end of the leadership spectrum. You could argue that would make him more attractive to Wildrose members after he wins the PC leadership. But it's debatable whether you can win the leadership these days from the right. Ted Morton, a political scientist turned politician, used to try.

Kenney endorsed Morton when he ran for the Alberta PC leadership in 2006 and finished third. Morton tried again in 2011, without Kenney's endorsement, finished fourth, and threw his support to the guy who wound up losing to Alison Redford. It's not exactly a trail blazed in glory.

Politics is often the art of the impossible. In 2002 when Stephen Harper returned to federal politics, not a lot of columnists predicted a decade at 24 Sussex Drive for him. In 1990 it was fashionable in some circles to call



Jean Chrétien "yesterday's man."

If human agency counted for nothing in this business it would be no fun to write about it. But the road to power in Alberta is suddenly trickier than it has been for decades. Surely Jason Kenney, one of the keenest students of politics I've met, has noticed this.

- 3 tbsp (45 mL) rice wine vinegar
- 4 tsp (20 mL) grainy mustard
- 4 tsp (20 mL) olive oil
- 1½ tsp (7 mL) honey
- ¾ tsp (4 mL) salt
- 2 cups (500 mL) coarsely grated beets
- 2 cups (500 mL) coarsely grated carrots
- ¼ cup (60 mL) pumpkin seeds
- 6 oz (180 g) 8 Canadian chuck burgers

Town of Morinville raises Treaty 6 flag on National Aboriginal Day

The 20th Annual National Aboriginal Day was celebrated in Morinville June 21 with ceremonial drumming and the raising of the Treaty 6 flag above Town Hall on 100 Avenue.

The Town of Morinville announced last week that Council had unanimously supported a request to proclaim June 21 National Aboriginal Day in Morinville.

In recognition of National Aboriginal Day Chief Kurt Burnstick, Councillors Edwin Paul and Audra Arcand, and elders Ron Arcand, Clarence Arcand, Narcisse Paul, Linda Arcand and Sam Burnstick attended the ceremony along with Buffalo Plains Drum Group members from Alexander First Nation. Ceremonial drumming took place ahead of and after the flag raising, which was performed by Mayor Lisa Holmes and Elder Sam Burnstick.

Chief Burnstick thanked the Creator for the day, thanked his elders for attending the event, and the Town for honouring Alexander with the invite.

"It is an important day for them," Burnstick said. "It is an important day for all Treaty people because it's who we are. The significance of this event — it's so important to Alexander. We've never experienced this in Morinville before. My hat's off to the mayor and Town Council and the Town because it's paying homage to us as Treaty Indians."

Burnstick pointed out this year marks the 140th anniversary of the signing of Treaty 6. He went on to thank RCMP in attendance who wore Red Serge.

Councillors Nicole Boutestein and Stephen Dafoe assisted the mayor in handing out gifts to the Chief and Elders.

ASBA signs Joint Commitment to Action on First Nations, Métis and Inuit education

The Alberta School Boards Association announced June 22 it had signed a Government of Alberta Joint Commitment to Action on Indigenous education on behalf of the province's 61 publicly-funded school boards.

The ASBA cites the signing as helping to further the goals of better student achievement results and establishing inclusive learning environments for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students.

"Together with our education partners we are signing an historic and significant agreement," said ASBA President Helen Clease in a release Wednesday. "School boards across the province have been concerned about the gap in FNMI student achievement and success, and we have

-been working together with our education partners to close that gap. This agreement will enable us to support school boards across Alberta as they work within their school divisions to support First Nations, Métis and Inuit student achievement and establish inclusive learning environments."

The ASBA Board of Directors established a Task Force on First Nations, Métis and Inuit Student Success and Wellbeing in 2010. The task force was expanded a year later to include representatives from the Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA), the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA), the Alberta Regional Professional Development Consortia (ARPCD), the College of Alberta School Superintendents (CASS) and Alberta Education. In 2014, the task force established the annual Indigenous Shining Student Award, celebrating First Nations, Métis

and Inuit students who are shining examples in their communities.

Under the commitment to action, school board trustees will be expected to understand, support and implement locally-appropriate curriculum that supports the culture, history, perspectives, experiences and contributions of Canada's First Nations, Métis and Inuit people.

"To support our trustees in that role, ASBA will design, develop and implement professional learning opportunities and resource materials for school boards and trustees, and we are very excited about this opportunity," Clease said. "We will also continue to work collaboratively with our education partners, Alberta Education and First Nations, Métis and Inuit representatives to ensure that Indigenous regional context, foundational knowledge and culture are promoted, understood and respected."

It's Our Business

Vet clinic offering innovative option for proper animal care

Good preventive health care for pets makes a big difference in their lives, according to the staff of the Morinville Veterinary Clinic. The clinic recently launched its Optimum Care program, a group of preventive health plans designed to keep pets healthy through important routine care, reducing the risk of disease by detecting any issues early on, and reducing the cost of pet ownership by spreading those costs over 12 months.

Veterinarian Kelli Kinsman sees the initiative as an important one for the clinic and the animals they care for. "It is an important initiative in that it helps spread out that cost for overall wellness care," she said. "You are not having to pay a huge lump sum at one time."

By way of example, Kinsman said the Optimum Care Enhanced Puppy Package includes Five no-charge office visits, routine puppy vaccination series, nail trimming, dewormings for roundworms and hookworms, and nutritional consultation. Additional items include training and behaviour consultation, growth/body condition monitoring, spay or neuter pre-anesthetic blood work, spaying or neutering, and discounts on additional products and services.

Similar service packages are available for adult and senior dogs and felines at all stages

of life. "For lots of us, having a big lump sum becomes difficult," Kinsman said. "This allows people to spread out the cost of some of that care. That general care - if you have a problem - you are not afraid to take it to the vet. Now you know, you already have your five exams included in that price."

Kinsman said pet owners want the best they can for their animal, but often find themselves in a financial constraint. The Optimum Care Program helps alleviate some of the costs by spreading it out.

With five clinical visits included, Kinsman said it was the perfect opportunity for pet owners to stay ahead of their cat or dog's health, particularly in the senior years.

"Instead of doing a yearly check-up, it can be done more frequently," she said. "We can check on dental disease. We're checking for weight loss or weight gain. What is their hair coat like? What are their mobility issues? Are they stiff? Are they soar? We can maybe get ahead of some of these processes."

Kinsman said because blood work is included in the adult packages, people are more willing to establish a baseline as a preventative measure.

"We can catch things earlier rather than later," Kinsman said.

Programs are available for young, adult and senior cats and dogs. Professional association regulations do not allow vet clinics to advertise their prices. 


First responder radio system to launch July 1

The government announced Thursday that a new provincewide radio communication system will provide coverage for first responders through a system of hundreds of radio towers.

Presently, the province's first responders, including police, fire and emergency medical services use their own radio systems that usually do not communicate with one other.

The government says the Alberta First Responders' Radio Communication System (AFRRCS) changes that by making a networked system available to emergency personnel starting July 1.

"This important project will help protect the lives of Albertans, from families to first responders," said Kathleen Ganley, Minister of Justice and Solicitor General in a release Thursday. "This provincewide radio system will ensure that the people who keep us safe every day have the communication network they need to respond as quickly and as coordinated as possible."

Alberta RCMP Deputy Commissioner Marianne Ryan said the AFRRCS will provide radio coverage in major urban centres and remote locations where public and officer safety are equally critical.

"While the new radio system is about providing first responders with a vital tool to do their important work, it also demonstrates what can be achieved by multiple partners coming together to work towards a common goal," she said.

The province says the extensively-tested system was used during the Fort McMurray wildfire crisis where AFRRCS radios were issued to emergency personnel from across the province and country, enabling firefighters to communicate with each other and the operations centre.

"The AFRRCS was absolutely crucial for us and all of our partners as we battled the Fort McMurray wildfire," said Brad Grainger, Deputy Chief, Fort McMurray Fire Department. "The system allowed us to communicate efficiently with 32 different fire departments during the biggest crisis in our region's history."

Construction on \$438 million AFRRCS began in 2008 and 328 of the 332 sites have been completed with a full completion to occur this summer.




