Community comes through for the Morinville Food Bank

Two days of collections for the Morinville Food Bank Society resulted in 5720 pounds of food collected during the Annual Fill-a-Bus event, although an earlier tally on Friday indicated this year's haul was only 4211 pounds.

The annual charity event had a record year in 2013 with 7255 pounds collected. The following year saw a more than 50 per cent drop to 3546 pounds due to sub-zero weather. Last year's tally was 4378 pounds, 1342 pounds less than this year's final number. This year's numbers do not include a large donation of pet food from Champion Petfoods or several thousand dollars donated by individuals, businesses, and service clubs. Some of that money has been placed in trust with Scotia Bank, who have agreed to double the amount up to \$5000 again this year.

"We have so many great supporters in this town; I just can't believe it," said Food Bank organizer Ken Skjersven.

Skjersven said every day the Food Bank is open; they are seeing a two or three new people looking for help. "We had a young fellow the other day who didn't know which way was up," Skjersven said. "He said, 'I just don't know what I'm going to do.' And I said, '[Helping] is what we're here for.'"



Door-to-door energy sales banned in the new year

Albertans will ring in the New Year with fewer ringing door bells. Starting Jan. 1, 2017, Alberta will prohibit the unsolicited door-to-door selling of energy products to protect people from what the government says is misleading, high-pressure sales practices.

The door-to-door sales ban includes furnaces, natural gas and electricity energy contracts, water heaters, windows, air conditioners, and energy audits.

The province says it has received more than 1,000 complaints about energy-related, door-to-door sales, many of those from seniors and families who felt tricked into buying furnaces or water heaters on the spot. The government cites other instances of homes being visited as many as two to three times in one day by high-pressure salespeople.

"We heard loud and clear from Albertans who are frustrated by knocks on their doors and aggressive sales pitches in their homes," said Stephanie McLean, Minister of Service Alberta in a release. "That's why we're taking action to protect Albertans by ending aggressive door-to-door energy sales."

Gordon Voth, President, Seniors United Now, was pleased with Friday's announcement.

"We support the government's action to protect consumers from door-to-door energy sales," Voth said. "We know that seniors are often targets of misleading, high-pressure sales tactics and this ban will help prevent many seniors from feeling forced into energy contracts and purchases they don't need or want."

The government says energy companies still have multiple channels to sell directly to Albertans, including telephone and online sales, kiosks and conventional advertising. Despite the door-to-door ban, consumers are free to invite salespeople to their homes.



Council passes 3rd Reading of budget

half a million earmarked for South Glens roadwork

The average Morinville homeowner can expect to pay \$20 more next year for their property taxes. After over a month of the Town's new budget process, the Town now has its 2017 Operating Budget, and Long-Range Capital Plan passed.

The passing comes following a budget open house event, an online citizen budget tool, and council-administration budget workshop meetings. Council had a quick discussion and unanimously passed Third Reading of the 2017 Operating Budget and Long-Range Capital Plan with minimal changes. The only amendments made at Third Reading added a specific dollar amount dedicated to new roadwork in the South Glens development.

Councillor Boutestein moved the amendment to put in a \$500,000 line item in the Capital Budget dedicated to roads in South Glens. The actual cost of the project is unknown and is subject to negotiations between Town Administration and the developers. Previously the item had no budget amount attached due to this uncertainty.

Third reading comes following a round of changes made in second reading that saw community grant funding in half (\$10,000) from a motion by Councillor Dafoe. More than \$200,000 were added in for various trail system and park improvements. Additionally, \$52,000 was cut from the budget, removing the LAV III Monument project completely.

The budget in its current form posts a \$656,523 deficit in the Town's Tax-Supported Operational Budget. It is common practice for the Town to budget extremely conservatively, often posting actual budgets a million dollars or more higher than their budgeted amount. The consolidated budget, including normal tax operated Town services with utility services, posts a surplus of \$901,699.

All of the detailed figures and budget items are available for residents to read on the Town's websites, as with every year.

Budget means \$20 increase in tax bill

Moderate budget increases across the board and some new projects mean that residents will be paying about \$20 more in their property tax bill, about a 1 per cent increase, and below the Consumer Price Index. The actual increase including utility increases and education taxes is expected to be a \$35 increase. This is a smaller per cent increase than last year at 3 per cent. Town Administration acknowledged the difficult economic circumstances many are in and claimed this year's budget process was focused on keeping costs lower.

This year's budget process went quicker than last year, where Council delayed passing Third Reading in order to take more time to incorporate additional changes.

Council passes motions to consider Perras Place repairs, postpone demolition

Following two unanimous motions from Councillor Stephen Dafoe, Council has decided to temporarily hold off on demolishing Perras Place and consider the actual total costs of making necessary repairs to keep the century-old building up to code. These motions come following an impassioned speech given by community member Paul Riopel during a recent Committee of the Whole meeting, requesting that Council save the historical site slated for demolition by the Town next spring.

During his speech, Riopel noted





Sturgeon County Council Commits to Improving 128 km of local roads

Sturgeon County has committed to a ten-year plan to improve 128 kilometres of local roads using external contractors and pending available funding. County Council voted unanimously on the item at their Nov. 22 meeting.

Land issues, access to clay, economic conditions, and escalating costs have impacted the County's Local Road Reconstruction Program over the last few years, prompting a review of the Local Road Reconstruction Program. That review was completed with a "Let's Talk Roads" public education campaign, the latter giving the County the chance to hear from residents.

"This will give Transportation Services staff the opportunity to focus on road maintenance and operations improvements," said General Manager of Municipal Services Ian McKay in a release Wednesday. "Sturgeon County will be prioritizing roads for reconstruction based on criteria that considers condition, traffic and maintenance costs."

The County is planning to evaluate and prioritize roads in 2017, with engineering design, land acquisition, utility relocations, and the awarding of contracts taking place in 2018. Road reconstruction will begin in 2019.

The County says it is not planning a tax increase to fund the project. Program costs will be included in future capital budgets as funding is approved.

the importance of keeping this piece of history saying: "History is what provides an identity [to a community], giving a foundation from which to grow and prosper."

The structure, built in 1903, is currently owned by the Town and currently houses the Morinville & District Chamber of Commerce and the Visitor Information Centre, though both are already being moved to the main floor of St. Germain Place (Town Hall).

Town Administration feels that substantial repairs will be required to save the structure and keep it safe, particularly if it is going to continue being used commercially, though no substantial numbers have been made available yet.

Neither Dafoe nor any other member of Council offered their support to saving Perras Place Nov. 22. Dafoe's motions were only dedicated to receive information about the costs required to bring the centre back up to code and preventing its demolition until a discussion on those costs could be had.





Local business welcomes new vaping rules

"Overall, I'm okay with the [proposed] regulations. I'm not overly excited about them, but I'm not disappointed either," said Thomas Kirsop in reflection of new legislation proposed to regulate the vaping industry by the Federal Government last week. Kirsop and his wife, Marjorie, are the owners of Morinville's only Vape Shop, Alternatives and Options – Vaporizers and E-liquids Ltd.

The Government of Canada said on Nov. 22, the intent behind the proposed legislation is in large part to protect youth.

The tabled amendments are laid out in the draft Tobacco and Vaping Product Act (a modernization of Canada's Tobacco Act); it addresses vaping and e-cigarettes as an entirely separate entity from tobacco products, such as cigarettes and cigars.

"Other places, like the United States and in the EU, tend to lump the two together, but there's a massive difference in their harm levels," said Kirsop in an interview. "When you group those two [industries] together, you're sending the message that there's no difference between vaping and smoking. Separating the two is a huge step."

Health Canada indicated in a press release that legislators mindfully treated vaping products as a separate class of products from tobacco, which "allow adults to access vaping products as likely less harmful alternatives to tobacco use." The Ministry continues, however, to stress there remains the potential for adverse health effects from vaping, particularly related to nicotine addiction in young people.

"The proposed legislation would establish a flexible regime that can be adjusted as the science on vaping products develops," noted Health Canada in a report.


Vaping has been described in some studies as a "cleaner" way to use nicotine since it does not contain ingredients like tar and other cancer-causing chemicals like tobacco does.

"I'm actually kind of hopeful about [the proposed changes] because they are issues that need to be addressed....these products go into my customers' lungs, there should be some accountability there."

Kirsop said one of the most notable issues that have personally bothered him is marketing vaping products to youth. "I've seen things that would shock you," he said, referencing a vaping product (e-liquid) he once saw where the packaging looked exactly like a juice box.

"A lot of [the problems] have to do with, not so much the flavour but the packaging and marketing. You see trade and copyright infringements a lot out there too. Why would I send somebody home with a package of e-liquid that looks like [a juice box]? Think of how much nicotine is in a bottle of e-liquid; it should be stored in the same places as where you put other things you don't want the kids to get ahold of. I don't want anyone to have a mishap. Kids drink juice boxes, do you really want to have 100mg of nicotine sitting around looking like a juice box? You're just asking for trouble."

"I try to keep in mind that I have four kids. I know what I want for them. I know what I'd like to see for all of my customers, and it's



important to me."

Other potential rules for the vaping industry are related to advertising standards, promotion of vaping products, age verification requirements for those purchasing online, and prohibition of certain ingredients in e-liquid.

The other changes proposed in the Tobacco and Vaping Product Act include banning menthol in most tobacco, requiring plain packaging for products, and updating provisions around tobacco control.

Jane Philpot, Canada's Minister of Health, said in a statement on Nov. 22, "The introduction of this important legislation is the next step in the Government's work to protect young Canadians from nicotine addiction and tobacco use. At the same time, it introduces an approach to vaping products that considers their potential benefits to smokers. I look forward to seeing this Bill through the legislative process."

The Government of Canada does not currently legislate vaping products; however, some provinces do have regulations in place. Alberta does not currently have any legislation addressing vaping rules.

Though there is currently nothing prohibiting him from doing so, Kirsop said, "we don't sell to anyone under 18-years-of age. Morally, we won't do it."

As someone who started smoking at the age of nine, Kirsop said he understands how addicting the habit can be. It wasn't until about 30-years later when he discovered vaping that he finally quit; "...the last cigarette I ever smoked was the one I put out when I walked into that [vape] shop... it's not a difficult transition to go from one to the other because the habit is the same."

Government placing electricity price cap to protect consumers

The Government of Alberta says it is protecting families, farms and small businesses with a ceiling on electricity prices as the province makes necessary reforms to the electricity system.

Regulated electricity rates have been volatile, increasing by as much as 65 per cent (or 4.66 cents per kilowatt hour) in a single month, the government says, citing April of 2011 as a peak high and June 2014 as a peak low (4.14 cents per kilowatt hour drop).

The government plans to have the rate ceiling implemented by next June. At that time, the government says Albertans will pay no more than 6.8 cents per kilowatt hour. The ceiling will remain in effect for four years.

"Previous Alberta governments experimented with a risky and volatile form of electricity deregulation," Premier Notley said in a release. "This



experiment left families, businesses and our economy at the mercy of sudden price spikes and uncertainty like we've seen in the past and need to protect against in the future."

The government says during the four years the rate ceiling is in effect, consumers on the Regulated Rate Option (RRO) will pay the lower of the market rate or the government's ceiling rate and will be automatically applied to consumers bills on the regulated rate.

The Minister of Energy will start consulting in December, reaching out to distributors, RRO providers, retailers, and consumers.

Notley went on to say the rate ceiling is part of other electricity reforms to be announced later this week, including measures the government says will "enhance Alberta's market framework to create the conditions for private investment affordability, reliability and price stability."

Wildrose Shadow Electricity & Renewables Minister Don MacIntyre was not impressed with the NDP government's changes to Alberta's electricity system.

"Today, the NDP government has admitted their policy changes mean Albertans should expect nearly a doubling of current electricity costs," MacIntyre said in a released statement, noting the regulated rate option sits at 3.8 cents per kilowatt-hour, less than half the amount in the government's cap announcement.

"Their shutdown of coal, tax increases on power companies and ongoing legal battles have caused investor confidence in our province to plummet and will lead to further volatility caused by the NDP and increased costs for our power system."


